Service	<p>The Camrose Primary Care Network (PCN) houses a weekly prenatal clinic, which includes a team of family doctors, registered and licensed practical nurses, and other healthcare providers, who are committed to providing women with quality care and education throughout the duration of their pregnancy.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> As soon as your pregnancy is confirmed, you may start accessing prenatal services. You may self-refer into the prenatal program, or your physician may refer you on your behalf. Prenatal team also works together and collaborates with and/or refer patients to the obstetrician or other specialists and community providers (i.e. Public Health), as needed during your pregnancy. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Early intervention programs for children who are between birth and 3½ years of age and have developmental delays.
